I am writing to forward to you my concerns of the damage to nature that will happen if building of houses on the site at the south of Heathfield Gardens goes a head , I have walked those fields for over 20 years and twice seen one field absolutely destroy right in the breeding season and reported those responsible only for them to get only a warning. Plus putting up dormouse boxes after destroying this field , I have shown Councillor Mr Tony Ganly my finds which I have on my Google photos of exact locations of the nature pictures as I work for him. There are rare dormice, glow worms, slow worms , common lizards , marbled white butterflies, brown argus butterfly, common brown, ringlet, skippers, common blue, small copper, gatekeeper, red admiral, peacock, green veined white, large white, small white , puss moth , lesser stag beetle , sexton burrowing beetles and over 200 species of wild flowers including lots of early purple orchids. I will try to forward my pictures to you . Also the site at Fair Lane, The vicarage and the mission room have bat's and barn owls I will try to attach these pictures too.













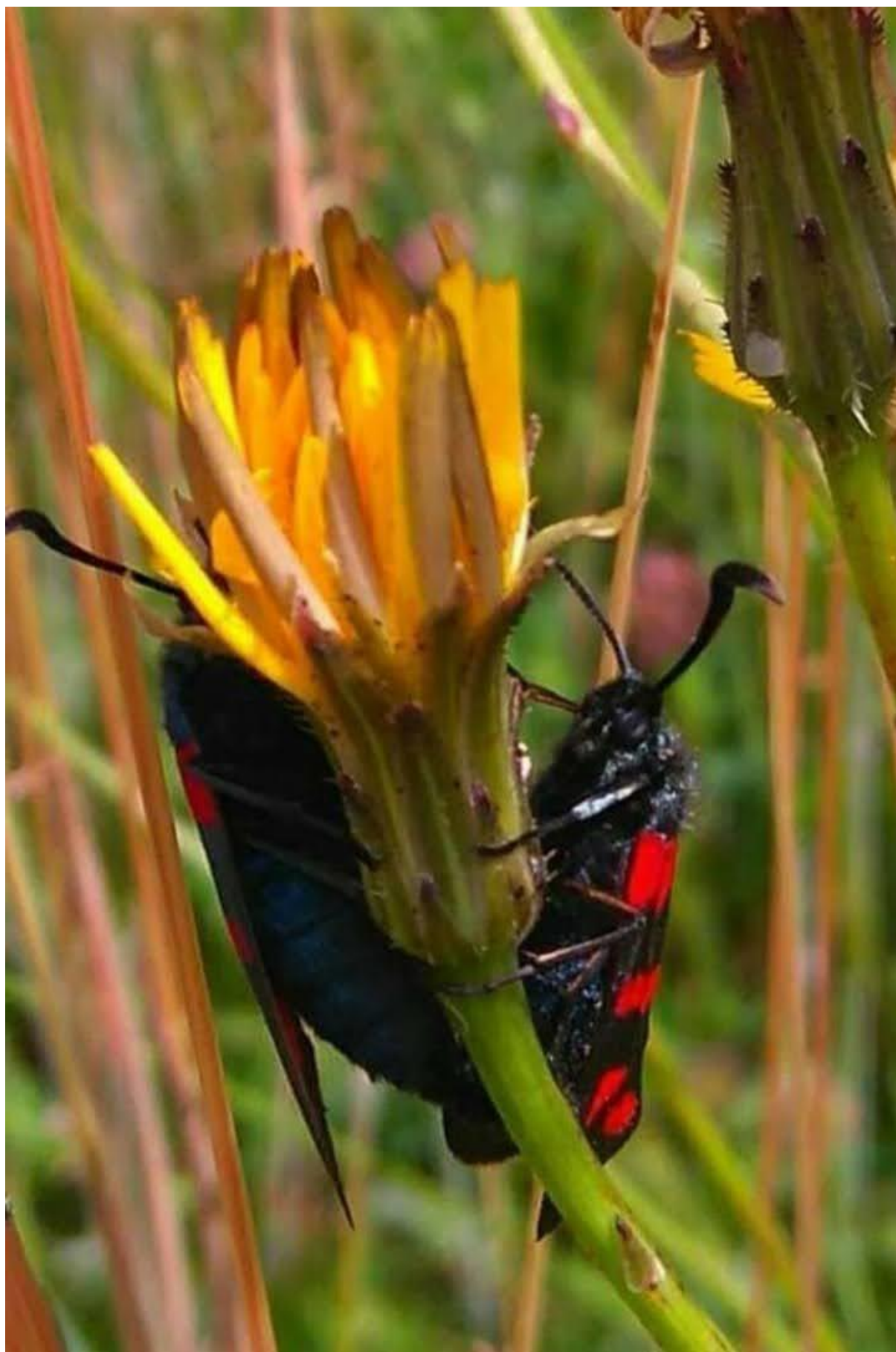
























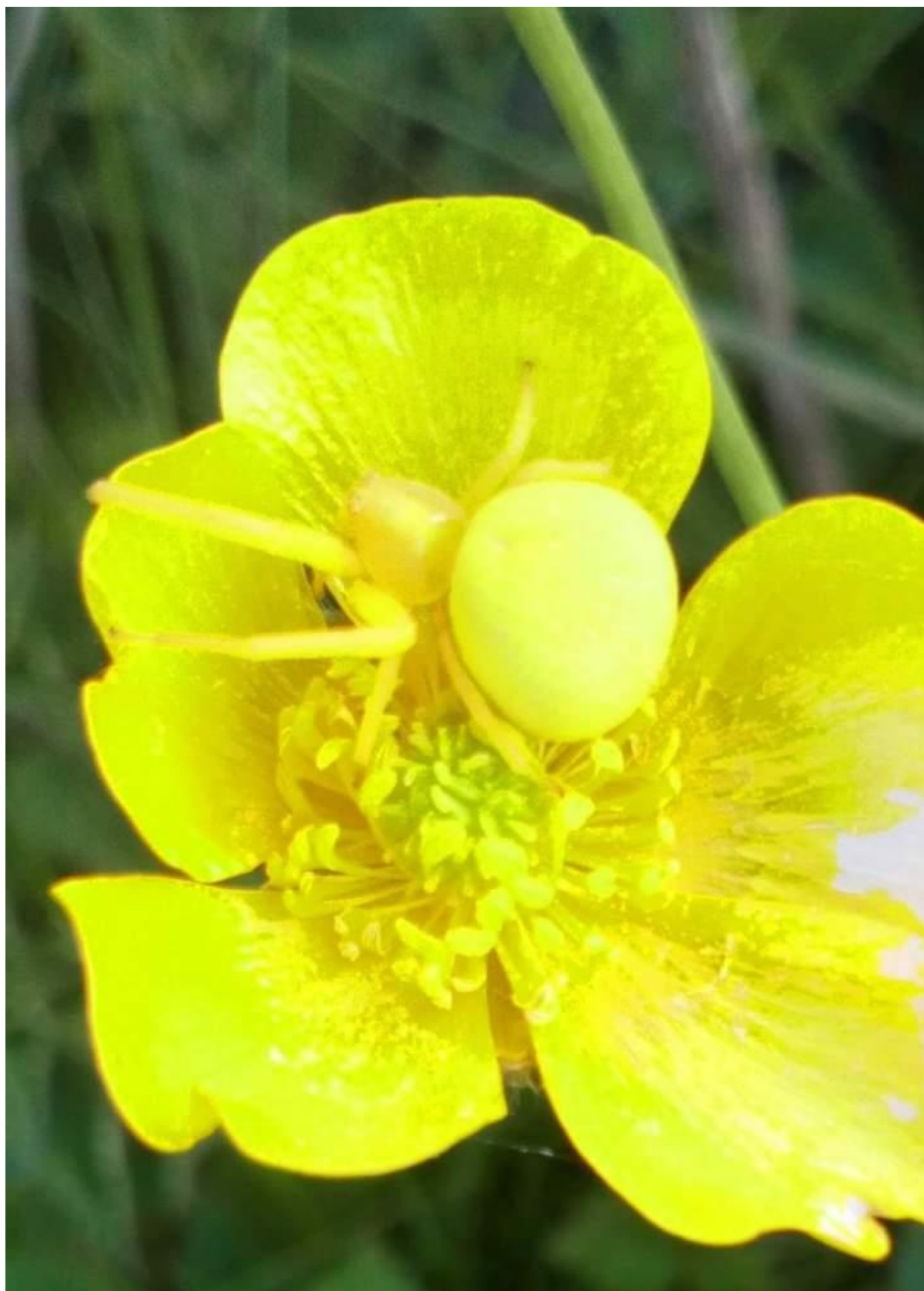
